Loire reds 2014

From the delicate charms of Pinot Noir to the earthy aromatics of Cabernet Franc, the Loire offers a variety of reds to refresh the palate. Jim Budd has picked 30 of his favourites from the successful 2014s, and says that now is the perfect time to rediscover the region's wines.

2014 WAS ONE of those September 'Miracle' vintages that often see a potentially disastrous Loire harvest. In late August producers were looking grim – a cold, damp August made them wonder whether the grapes would ever ripen properly. Philippe Bozec of Domaine Delos Boccard, Bourgueil, recalls the desperate vigneron who started to light candles in their local church, and even considered a papain sacrifice by sacrificing a flavoursome chicken.

After two difficult and small vintages, needed in a good vintage was particularly acute in most parts of the Loire, with the exception of the Central Loire vineyards such as Sancerre and Rully-Yzeuse, which had escaped the severe frost of 16 and 17 April 2012. This 2012 April frost had hit many hard, with yields frequently down before 2000ha. Unfortunately 2013 was equally difficult, with a prolonged cold spring and flowering not starting until mid- to late-June; yields were again very low. So the stakes in 2014 were high. Another devastating April frost or poor flowering could well mean bankruptcy.

The growing season started with a very warm March, with more than 200 hours of sunshine leading to a fairly early bud-break, late in March in Anjou, and up to early April further east. Naturally this promised unusual among producers, but the critical period of April and early May was frost-free.

Vincent Puard, Vendanges Entières (£23.75) Sancerre 2012. Austerly in taste, mineral, steely, with complexity and depth. The French have an excellent natural wine. **Drink 2018-2025 Alc 13%**

Daniel Crochet

£14.95 (2012) Sancerre. A rare example of a red Sancerre with lovely rounded fruit, structure and well-integrated tannins. **Drink 2016-2020 Alc 13%**

Domaine du Corre, Le Jaudes

£16.95 (2012) Sancerre. Barrel sample. Delightfully mineral, steely, with a touch of citrus. The Sancerre that successfully mixes fruit with minerality. **Drink 2016-2020 Alc 13%**

Vincent Delaporte, Cul de Beaujeu

£23.29 (2012) Lea & Sandeman.

Austere, complex. Wonderfully textured black fruits. Length, balance. **Drink 2018-2032 Alc 13%**

Domaine Valheron, Baie de Bourgneuf

£19.95 (2012) Sancerre.

Stylish, elegant. Long-integrated tannins, mineral, balanced. A touch of citrus with emphasis on fruit rather than colour. Delicate red fruit, complexity. Length, balance. **Drink 2018-2032 Alc 13.5%**

Domaine Pella, Marçay

£16.95 (2012) Bourgueil. Barrel sample. Central Loire, a mix of good red fruit, texture, subtlety and balance. Length. **Drink 2016-2022 Alc 13%**

Rully

Claude Lafosse, Cuvée André

£16.95 (2012) www.claudelafosse.com. From the late-ripening Rully, aged after the grape skins. Bright, complex, refined. Red fruit, citrus. **Drink 2017-2025 Alc 13%**

Coteaux du Giennois

Joseph Millet, Les Champs de Cozance

£16.95 (2012) Bourgueil. Blend of Pinot Noir and Gamay with an active, lively texture as well as some structure and length. **Drink 2016-2032 Alc 13%**

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£23.29 (2012) Lea & Sandeman

Barrel sample. Wonderfully textured black fruits. Length, balance. **Drink 2018-2032 Alc 13%**
